All tours are guided by registered South African Tourist Guides with a valid professional driver's permit + license. Our businesses and vehicles are fully compliant with all relevant Tourism and Road Transportation authorities, with a valid road transportation permit and passenger liability insurance cover. Proof of all legal requirements is available on request.

Initial reservations need to be made telephonically or via email, to check and ensure availability. If there is, Anekie will then send a confirmation, invoice and the deposit requirements. A deposit of R2 500 per person travelling will secure the reservation.

Please ensure that your surname is used as the deposit reference on the right bottom corner of the bank deposit form. A copy of the deposit slip and the completed reservation form needs to be faxed to 011 782 5416.

On receipt of the deposit Anekie will confirm your seat on the trip in writing. The full balance needs to be paid at least two months before departure.

Guiding principles applied on the design of the tours:

South Africa is a large country, with a big diversity of geographical areas, landscapes, people and cultures, places of interest, wildlife, cities and town, and more. So the focus always is to capture this variety on offer, at the right time of the year to maximize the guest's enjoyment of the trip. Tours are planned to ensure guests not only see, but also experience South Africa. This is achieved by having less traveling time, short distances per day, no traveling at night, many convenience and sightseeing stops, doing interesting excursions and activities, choosing the right places to stay and eat, and allowing for flexible itineraries.

Passengers will be picked up and dropped off from their homes on all tours in Johannesburg area. Departures are mostly over weekend to avoid peak hour congestion on the road. Tours are done mostly outside school holidays to avoid the crowds, and planned according to the best seasons to visit the area. Quality, quaint and charming accommodation is chosen for guests to experience true South African hospitality, with easy access to rooms, on-suite bathrooms, very friendly hosts, excellent meals and more.

Tours are conducted by registered tourist guides, with knowledge of the areas. Transportation is in clean and serviced vehicles, fully insured, and well-maintained. The seats are all individual and comfortable with safety belts for each passenger. The trailer used for luggage is also licensed and roadworthy.

We comply with the necessary legislation regarding insurance cover whilst on tour with passengers. This insurance cover included passenger liability and public liability whilst on tour. Your own individual travel insurance is also recommended for any of the tours.

There is a minimum of 6, and maximum of 7 passengers per trip, (in most cases only 6 per trip), which enhances the enjoyment of the trip. Travelling in smaller groups creates more time to enjoy the sights on route, and not to rush because of time constraints caused by bigger groups.

The focus of the tour is on the journey and not the destination only. On some days the distances are long, and on some roads there are road works taking place, which adds to the traveling time. During the regular stops guests are encouraged to do some exercises to prevent travel fatigue.

For everyone's safety, the maximum distance per day (and only on certain days), is 550 kilometres, and driven in daylight. On most days the distances are much less than that. Regular convenience stops are made on the route, as well as stops for coffee and lunches at scenic spots.

Departures are from the Johannesburg Metropolitan area. Alternative arrangements will be made for departures from outside the Johannesburg region, at a small additional fee.

Special conditions regarding mobility of guests:

All effort is made to ensure the places we visit and stay is easily access-able to all. On all tours there are inevitably areas that involve climbing of steps, walking to attractions, walking on uneven ground and surfaces, etc. All persons on tour must be able to do these activities un-assisted and without delaying their fellow passengers.

Should travellers not be able walk freely, climb steps or do any activities un-assisted, they would be required to have their own assistance (a person travelling with them) to ensure fellow travellers are not affected by this. The Hola Tourism Network, Annie needs to be informed of any such conditions before the reservation is made.

Although no age limit applies to participation in the tours, it is important to declare any medical conditions on the reservation form which will be sent when the reservation is made. The Hola Tourism Network reserves the right to cancel the reservation if a person's medical condition is too much of a risk to undertake any of the trips.

For everyone's comfort and fairness, seats in the vehicle are rotated on a daily basis. No specific seat can be reserved in the vehicle due to a medical condition or handicap. Everyone needs to rotate seats.

The chosen accommodation always has on-suite bathroom facilities, but the choice of a bath or shower cannot always be specified or guaranteed. Should this be a problem, please enquire before a reservation is made.

Guests must be aware of the traveling distances covered per day, and that it may be longer on certain days due to continuous road works. Please feel free to inquire about the conditions, activities and access-ability on any of the trips.

Terms and conditions and relevant useful information:

Pricing and departure dates: All tours for 2018 have been agreed upon and fixed at the published rates. Once you have booked and paid the relevant deposits, these prices will be maintained. **Only in the event of real dramatic increase in costs or if there are less than the minimum people required, will pricing be changed in consultation with persons inquiring about new reservations.**

Inclusions and Exclusions on all Itineraries: * except Namibia as indicated *****

Included: Accommodation, breakfast, lunch, dinner, entrance fees, flight (s) and transfer (s) where needed, tourist guide, vehicle.

Excluded: Drinks, laundry, telephone calls, curios, portorage, gratuities and personal items

Deposits: Each reservation must be booked telephonic to check availability. Once it has been confirmed telephonically with Annie, an invoice and reservation form will be forwarded to you. The reservation then requires an initial deposit of R2 500 per person to secure the seat on the trip. Once the deposit and completed reservation form has been received, a confirmation letter will be sent.

Please note if you have booked a trip which includes a flight, the deposit is used to book the flight ticket. If you then want to cancel the trip, there cannot be a refund on the cost of the flight ticket. Unfortunately flights cannot be cancelled any more.

Minimum numbers: All tours have been designed for a minimum of 6 persons on tour. Should it happen that the trip does not get the required minimum passengers a refund will be given

Trip 1 – Pilanesberg

Duration: 4 days Departure: 21 January 2018 Last day: 23 January 2018

Overview

A 4 day guided safari around Pilanesberg National Park. One of the largest volcanic complexes of its kind in the world. The early presence of man can be seen in the numerous Stone and Iron Age sites that are scattered throughout the park. With this trip, we stay at the lovely Manyane camp that has well equipped self-catering chalets in face brick and this is a lovely camp with walking routes for those that enjoy birds, trees and nature as you will spot some impala and other wild life in the camp.

Day 1: January 21

Depart as early as possible for your safari in Pilanesberg. Enter the Pilanesberg National park and start your game viewing. Book into Manyane Camp around midday, enjoy lunch and depart for your late afternoon open vehicle game drive. Returning to Manyane for dinner.

Day 2 : January 22

Wake up call early and a game drive in air conditioned vehicle until about 09h00. Back to Manyane for breakfast. Relax until lunch time, explore the Lodge OR enjoy more game viewing for the rest of the day, visiting hides and Pilanesberg centre. Dinner and overnight at Manyane.

Day 3: January 23

Early morning game drive and return to Manyane Camp for breakfast. Return to Johannesburg after breakfast

Cost of the 4-day tour is R5 200 per person sharing. Single supplement is R2 000
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Trip 2 - Cape Town

Duration: 5 days Departure: 24 February 2018 Last day: 28 February 2018

Overview

A 5 day escorted tour around Cape Town, we will travel along one of the most beautiful stretches of South Africa's coastlines from Cape Town to Cape Point, Boulder's beach, Stellenbosch and if the weather is good have a ride up to Table Mountain in the cable cars for a bird's eye view of the city and visit Kirstenbosch

Day 1: 24 February

Today you will be transferred to the OR Tambo International Airport in time for your flight to Cape Town International Airport. You will be met at the Cape Town Airport by your tourist guide and will make your way to your Guesthouse for the next few nights at one of our favourite Guesthouses in the Cape. The rest of the day at leisure until dinner

Day 2: 25 February

Today we embark on a full day tour of the Cape Peninsula. Take in the beaches of Clifton and Camps Bay, before crossing over to Hout Bay.

From here we drive to the Cape of Good Hope Nature Reserve via Chapman's Peak, one of the world's most breathtaking coastal drives, where we will board a funicular to get to the top of the Peninsula to witness the symbolic meeting of the Indian and Atlantic Oceans and enjoy spectacular views over False Bay. After lunch, continue to Simonstown, the naval base, and visit the African Penguin breeding colony at Boulders Beach. Then stop at the world-renowned Kirstenbosch Gardens before arriving back at your Guesthouse.

Day 3: 26 February

Your tour will take in the Houses of Parliament, the Castle (built between 1666 and 1679, this is South Africa's oldest building), the lively Greenmarket Square with its daily market, the Company Gardens.

Weather permitting we will take the cable car up Table Mountain, which will give you spectacular views over the city and the Peninsula (the cable car fee is NOT included as it is weather dependent).

From here we make our way to the Waterfront where you have the rest of the afternoon free to explore at the V & A Wharf in Cape Town. We will meet up later for dinner at one of the restaurants on the V & A Waterfront.

Day 4: February 27

This delightful drive winds its way to the heart of the Cape Winelands, through superb mountain ranges, vineyards and Cape Dutch homesteads. We enjoy some wine tasting at a few wine farms in Stellenbosch. Lunch at one of the farms. Return to Cape Town in the late afternoon. Dinner at one of the local restaurants.

Day 5: February 28

Today you will be taken back to the Cape Town Airport in time for your outbound flight back home.

Cost of the 5-day tour is R10 500 per person sharing. Single supplement is R2 400

Trip 3 - The Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park

Duration: 9 days Departure: 3 March 2018 Last day: 11 March 2018

Overview

The 3.7 million hectare Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park is one of the world's largest conservation areas, and is sanctuary to herds of gemsbok, springbok, blue wildebeest, eland, red hartebeest, as well as the black-mane Kalahari lions, leopard and cheetah. There is 60 species of mammals, as well as reptiles and amphibians. It has 307 bird species, and 52 of the registered 80 raptors have been registered in the park.

Day 1: March 3

We depart early morning from Johannesburg. On route to Kuruman, we travel through Ventersdorp and Vryburg, where we have lunch. On arrival in Kuruman we visit the Eye of Kuruman and depart for Kathu not far from Kuruman. Check in and overnight stay at the Namakwari Lodge in Kathu.

Day 2: March 4

After breakfast, we continue the journey toward the Kgalagadi Park. The route is via Olifantshoek towards Upington where we will have lunch. We then drive in a northerly direction towards the town of Askham. It is a slow drive, and around every corner you will see more dune landscapes. We arrive at the Kgalagadi Lodge (5km from the gate) and check into the well- appointed chalets for two nights stay.

Day 3: March 5

Depart early for a full day safari with brunch at Achterlonie picnic spot, looking for animals in the dry Auob riverbed. Return to the Kgalagadi Lodge mid afternoon for a tour of the Meerkats (if available)

Day 4: March 6

After a healthy breakfast, we depart into the park. Driving in the dry river beds we start our search for the animals of the Kgalagadi, visiting various water holes and picnic spots during the day before we book into Nossop camp in the afternoon for the next 3 nights.

Day 5/6: March 7 & 8

After breakfast made by your host, enjoy game viewing every day. Stopping at picnic spots and water holes. Sit at the Hide at Nossop and wait for the animals. Your host will prepare meals for you in camp every night.

Day 7: March 9

After another early morning wilderness drive followed by breakfast, it will be time to leave Nossop and make our way to Twee Rivieren gate. Enjoy a picnic lunch on route at a picnic site or at Twee Rivieren. Overnight at the Molopo Kalahari Lodge.

Day 8: March 10

Depart after breakfast travelling via Kathu where we will stop for a nice lunch and then on to Vryburg where we will overnight at the Lavender Guesthouse. ***** optional fly back from Upington for own account.**

Day 9: March 11 This is your last day with the Kgalagadi tour and after breakfast, we depart for Johannesburg. Arriving late afternoon.

Cost of the 9-day tour is R19 600 per person sharing. Single supplement is R3 800

Trip 4 – Game Parks Kwazulu Natal

Duration: 8 days Departure: 10 March 2018 Last day: 17 March 2018

Overview

The northern and central region of Kwazulu Natal has so much to offer to tourists. It varies from the rolling green hills, to high mountains, to the warm Indian Ocean, to its beautiful national parks and private game reserves, and the St. Lucia Wetlands region

Day 1: March 10

We firstly travel along the N4 towards Middelburg, (coffee break) where we turn off towards Ermelo, where we will enjoy lunch. After lunch it is another 2 hours comfortable drive towards Piet Retief, where we will stay overnight at the Dusk to Dawn guest farm. It is lovely working farm, and guests can explore the farm on foot, before enjoying a wonderful dinner prepared by our hosts.

Day 2: March 11

After a wonderful farm breakfast, we depart along the N2 route, towards Hluhluwe, where we check into the Hluhluwe Hotel for the next 2 night's stay. It's a great base to explore the area from. A light meal will be enjoyed on arrival, and you can also relax and enjoy the lovely gardens and swimming pool. At around 14h00, we take a short drive to the entrance of the Hluhluwe / Umfolozi Game Reserve. This reserve is a classical big 5 reserve, but is mostly known for its conservation efforts to save the black and white rhinos. We do our first game drive, which is a lovely 3 hour game drive.

Day 3: March 12

Today is set aside to explore the Greater St. Lucia Wetland Park, which is one of South Africa's 7 World Heritage Sites. It is also known as Isimangaliso. We do a scenic drive towards the town of St Lucia, where we do a morning boat cruise on the estuary to view the crocodile, hippos, wildlife and birdlife that makes the estuary such a great attraction to visit. After the lovely 2- hour boat-trip it is time for lunch in town. This is followed by a pleasant walk alongside the beachfront and river mouth area, and exploring the town on foot.

Day 4: March 13

After breakfast and checking out, we depart towards the Hluhluwe / Umfolozi Game Reserve again. This time we explore another part of the park, including a nice coffee stop at a picnic area, as well as lunch at the Hilltop camp. In the mid to late afternoon, we depart from the park for a short 50 km drive to the town of Mkuze. We arrive and check into the Ghost Mountain Inn for 3 nights. It is a beautiful hotel with a lovely history and story. Relax in the beautiful surroundings of the lodge

Day 5: March 14

We depart on a short drive to the Jozini dam, where we embark on a boat trip on the dam. This boat cruise travels alongside the side of the dam, to view game on the adjoining game farms. It is a very different from other game viewing activities, and a wonderful experience. The boat is big, with all the necessary ablution facilities on board. The boat cruise is approximately 4 hours, after which we return to the lodge for afternoon relaxation.

Day 6: March 15

We depart around 10h30 on a game drive into the Mkuze Game Reserve. This park is well known for its wonderful birdlife and viewing of animals and birds alongside the rivers and dams. The game is approximately 6 hours, which will also include a lovely picnic lunch at a picnic site in the park. We return in the late afternoon.

Day 7: March 16

Sadly we have to leave this beautiful area, departing towards Wakkerstroom.
Lunch in Wakkerstroom. Book into Forellenhof Guest Farm .
Enjoy a walk on the farm, do bird watching and then have a dinner prepared by our hosts.

Day 8: March 17

Sadly we have to leave this beautiful area after breakfast. We travel back to Johannesburg.

Cost of the 8-day tour is R14 800 per person sharing. Single supplement is R2 300

Trip 5 – Kruger Park – Satara & Skukuza

Duration: 6 days Departure: 14 April 2018 Last day: 19 April 2018

Overview

This trip is designed to visit the most popular region of Kruger Park, which is the central and southern part of the Park. Please keep in mind that Kruger Park is within a malaria area, and appropriate prevention is advised. Guests should consult a doctor.

Day 1: April 14

As it is a long day ahead of us, we depart early morning from Johannesburg to avoid any peak hour traffic. At either Belfast or Dullstroom we will stop for breakfast. We then continue through the picturesque Schoemanskloof valley, before crossing over the mountain towards Hoedspruit, where we will enjoy lunch. Upon entering the park we start with the first day of game viewing towards the Satara Rest Camp, where we will check in for the first two night's stay. Dinners for the whole trip will either be prepared by your host, or taken at the restaurant.

Day 2 : April 15

The area around Satara is rich with variety of game, so the day is set out to explore the area. A full day game viewing around the Satara area, returning to camp for dinner.

Day 3: April 16

Early morning wake up with coffee and rusks. We check out of the chalets for the day's travel to the next rest camp. We start with viewing the area surrounding Satara and then continue towards Skukuza. We then continue exploring some of the other roads on route to Skukuza. On arrival, we will check into the chalets for the last three nights stay in the park. Guests can visit the Steven Hamilton Memorial Library, to view the photo exhibition, and other interesting displays and books depicting the history and conservation focus of the park. Also enjoy a boardwalk walk alongside the Sabi River.

Day 4 & 5: April 17 and April 18

Once again enjoy coffee and rusks before departing on the game viewing for the day. The area around Skukuza is rich with variety of game, so the days are set out to explore the area. We will do various drives from the camp, enjoying breakfasts and lunches at either picnic spots, or some of the surrounding camp's restaurants. It will be two full days of game viewing in the areas, with time also set out for relaxing.

Day 6: April 19

Today it's time to leave this beautiful place towards home. We drive towards the Phabeni Gate, where we exit the park. Enjoy breakfast in Hazyview. We return via Nelspruit, Belfast and Middelburg on the main N4 route.

Cost of the 6-day tour is R13 800 per person sharing. Single supplement is R2 500

Trip 6 – Mapungubwe World Heritage Site

Duration: 5 days

Departure: 6 May 2018

Last day: 10 May 2018

Overview

The purpose of this specific tour is to expose more visitors to the wonderful Mapungubwe World Heritage Site. Come experience the natural beauty of this region, and you will be surprised by the beauty and diversity of the area.

Day 1: May 6

We depart early morning as we have a long drive ahead of us. It fortunately is all on the N1, which is a double highway. We travel on the N1 route towards Polokwane (formerly known as Pietersburg), and Makhado (Louis Trichard). The whole route from Makhado to Mapungubwe is covered by giant Baobab trees, which is excellent for photo opportunities. At Musina we turn in a westerly direction towards the Mapungubwe National Park. We stay in the park at a lovely self-catering guest house. We will for the duration of the tour have breakfast, lunch & dinner at the guest house.

Day 2: May 7

It is best to do the tour of Mapungubwe Hill early in the morning, otherwise it becomes too hot. So we will depart early on the short drive to Mapungubwe National Park. The park is concerned with conserving the fauna and flora of the Limpopo Valley as well as the fascinating African Iron Age archaeological sites, San rock art and dinosaur fossils and footprints. On arrival at the park our first guided trip will be to Mapungubwe Hill. On doing the guided trip to the "Hill", guest must also realise that there is a set of steps (easy going, but many – 147steps) to climb to get to the top of the hill. We do the climbing very slowly. Everyone that has done this previously, made it, and it was absolutely worth it. After doing the 3 hour guided tour to the Hill, we travel back to the guest house for a lovely brunch, and time to relax. Around 14h00 we will have a light meal before returning to the park to visit the wonderful Mapungubwe Museum and Information centre, where many of the artefacts and information of Mapungubwe Hill is on display.

Day 3: May 8

After a relaxing breakfast, it's time to visit the nature side of the Mapungubwe National Park on an open vehicle. We will travel via various paths in the park. Please note the drive focuses mainly on the natural beauty of the park – its fantastic landscapes, rock formations and Baobab trees, and not the animals only. The Northern boundary of the Park is the Limpopo River, and on its banks it has giant fever trees, Mashatu or Nyala berry trees and Sycamore fig trees. The look - out point overlooking the confluence of the Shashe and Limpopo rivers is an awe-inspiring vista where three countries - Zimbabwe, Botswana and South Africa - meet. This is where will enjoy a picnic lunch. Wildlife at present includes elephant, white rhino, leopard, hyena, giraffe, eland, gemsbok, blue wildebeest, red hartebeest, zebra, kudu, waterbuck, impala, bushbuck, klipspringer and other plains game.

Day 4: May 9

A more relaxed but very exciting day lies ahead. After a leisurely breakfast, we do a short drive to a private game farm adjoining the Mapungubwe. Here we will do a short nature walk to a very well preserved Rock art site. Our Guide will give us a very informative description of this very important site, which is in my own personal opinion, one of the best sites in the country. We return to the guest house for lunch, time for relaxation. Our last dinner will be at the guest house.

Day 5: May 10

After an early breakfast it is time to leave this beautiful area. We follow a different route towards Polokwane, where we join the N1 again, towards Johannesburg.

Cost of the 5-day tour is R12 800 per person sharing. Single supplement is R2 000

Day 1: May 20

Welcome to Namibia. You will be met by your private tour guide who will take you first to Windhoek city for a short sight seeing tour, before you will be transferred to a great lodge, 25 km south of Windhoek in the Auas Mountain area. Gocheganas is built on a hilltop overlooking a spectacular landscape and offering a unique combination of Wildlife, Nature and Wellness experiences. The Lodge offers game drives, walking activities on the 6000 hectare Nature Reserve. We recommend you to visiting the Wellness Centre at the lodge to relax after the flight while enjoying some treatments (not included in price)

Day 2 & 3: May 21 and 22

Today your guide will take you to the famous Sossusvlei, it is one of the main visitor attractions in Namibia. Your domicile for the next two nights is the Desert Homestead Outpost, situated about 30 km from the entrance to the Namib Naukluft Park. The Sesriem Canyon is 18 million years old and 30 meters deep. The canyon is small but very picturesque – many plants grow in the shade and shelter offered by the canyon, and water pools attract several species of birds and animals and the remarkable depths of the Canyon. The name Sesriem is Afrikaans and means six belts. Early settlers attached six belts together, (made of oryx hides), in order to lower buckets down into the canyon to scoop up water, from the pools that were inaccessible to their livestock.

The next morning you will visit some of the highest, bright-red sand dunes in the world on the Sossusvlei excursion. The colours of the dunes seem to change depending on the sun light a real photographer's delight! Visit the Dead Vlei, where red dunes provide a breathtaking backdrop to centuries old, dry scorched black trees standing in the desert. The area itself is a vast depression or clay pan, towered over by sand dunes up to 300 m high. A picnic breakfast will be served under a shady tree before return to the lodge.

Day 4 & 5: May 23 and 24

On this day your guide drives you towards Swakopmund via the scenic Kuiseb- and Gaub Pass, where stops are recommended at the view points for photo shooting and to enjoy the great views. After about 3 ½ hours you will reach the port town of Walvis Bay, from there you drive the last 35 kilometers along the coastal road to Swakopmund. This is a very scenic route with the Atlantic on your left and the dunes of the desert on your right side

The main beach area is called the Mole, and is the result of a largely unsuccessful attempt to construct the artificial harbour (as South Africa owned the only natural harbor in the area at Walvis Bay). Explore the lovely town in the afternoon and visit the old colonial buildings like the Lighthouse and the Otavi Bahnhof. A visit to the Museum is to recommend, which offers great information on Namibias History, ethnic groups. The most iconic symbol is the Swakopmund jetty, initially used as mooring for ships it later became a popular are for anglers and walkers, it has fallen into disrepair on numerous occasions and has been subject to several attempts to rescue it from complete dereliction. Recently large scale work has been completed on the jetty which now proudly boasts a small restaurant and bar area.

The next morning you depart at 07h45 to Walvis Bay for a Catamaran Ocean and dolphin cruise to Pelican Point is today's treat. Enjoy the antics of the seals jumping onboard and a good possibility of sightings of dolphins frolicking along-side the boat. Sparkling wine, fresh oysters and snacks are on the menu. Return to the harbor at 12h30 and Swakopmund, where the rest of the day is to your disposal. The tour is led by experienced guides and well-qualified and experienced skippers.

Day 6: May 25

Your route will take you to the next beautiful accommodation, which opened in November 2016. The Spitzkoppe Lodge is situated between huge granite boulders, which were created more than 150 million years ago. Here breath taking views onto the Brandberg and Erongo Mountains are guaranteed. Each stylish and private chalets has a outside viewing deck, which connects the guest with the vast stretches of untouched sand and boulders beyond. The Spitzkoppe is one of the most photographed mountains in Namibia and a popular attraction. The best photos can be taken just after sunrise or just before sunset. The light is then truly amazing. The peak of the mountain stand out dramatically from the flat surrounding plains. Many examples of Bushmen artwork can be seen painted on the rock in the Spitzkoppe

From here your guide takes you on an excursion to a Living Museum of the San, on Farm Omandumba. The many rock paintings in the Erongo region are evidence that the San lived here. Through colonization and conflicts with other language groups the cautious Bushmen were driven out of this area a long time ago. Omandumba now attempts to give the San the opportunity to make a living with their Living Museum in an area where their ancestors used to live. The name Omandumba is derived from one of the many Namibian languages, meaning "the place where the bitter bush grows".

Day 1: June 2

As it is a long day ahead of us, we depart early morning from Johannesburg to avoid any peak hour traffic. We will enjoy a brunch on the way to Kruger Park. We will travel towards Punda Maria gate on the N1 towards Polokwane. Upon entering the park we start with the first day of game viewing towards Punda Maria Rest Camp, where we will check in for the first 3 night's stay. Relax in the camp until it is time for dinner. Dinners for the whole trip will either be prepared by your host, or taken at the restaurant. Hopefully we get to see the Pel's Fishing Owl.

Day 2 & 3: June 3 and 4

We will do various drives from the camp, enjoying breakfasts and lunches at either picnic spots, or at some of the surrounding camp's restaurants. Enjoy coffee and rusks before departing on the game viewing for the day. The area around Punda Maria is rich with variety of game and majestic trees, so the days are set out to explore the area. We will do various drives from the camp

Day 4: June 5

Early morning wake up with coffee and rusks. We check out of the chalets for the day's travel to the next rest camp searching for the elusive big 5. We will stop at Babalala picnic spot to enjoy a lovely brunch. Visit Shingwedzi camp for coffee and tea. On arrival at Mopanie camp, we will check into the chalets for the next three nights stay in the park.

Day 5 & 6: June 6 and 7

Day 2: August 23

After breakfast, we depart towards Kakamas. On route we have rest stops at Olifantshoek and Upington. After lunch in Upington, we travel via Keimoes, exploring the Green Kalahari before arriving in Kakamas. This afternoon we will visit the spectacular Augrabies Waterfall on the outskirts of the town. The overnight stay and dinner is at the lovely Vergelegen Guesthouse.

Day 3: August 24

We depart for Springbok, with a rest stop at Pofadder, and on route we start seeing the first of the wild flowers. We visit the Goegap nature reserve in the afternoon, together with the Hester Malan Wildflower Garden. Overnight stay (for 2 nights) in Springbok

Day 4: August 25

After breakfast we travel slowly southwards towards Kamieskroon. This is where we visit the famous Skilpad Wildflower Reserve with its spectacular display of Namaqualand daisies.

Day 5: August 26

Today we travel south, through the well-known "Knersvlakte". Many succulent species will be seen along this route. After a rest stop and lunch at Vanrhynsdorp, we visit the Vanrhynsdorp succulent nursery. The overnight stay for the next two nights is in VanRhynsdorp.

Day 6: August 27

Today is set out to view the flowers of the Nieuwoudville area, visiting the Nieuwoudville Waterfall, the Hantam national botanical gardens and the Quiver Tree Forest. Enjoy the variety of bulb and plant species found in the area. Enjoy lunch in town. Return late afternoon the VanRhynsdorp

Day 7: August 28

After a leisurely breakfast we travel to Clanwilliam to visit the town and the beautiful Ramskop Wildflower Garden. After spending quality time in these magnificent gardens, it is time for lunch in town. In the afternoon we do a guided tour of a Rooibos Tea Farm (done by a specialist nature guide). Overnight stay for the next 2 nights is in Lambertsbay

Day 8: August 29

Today is set out to have some time to relax. We visit the local harbour and Bird Island. It is famous for its breeding colony of Gannets. Spend time relaxing in the afternoon, or experiencing the village life and beachfront areas.

Day 9: August 30

Today we continue to explore the wonders of the West Coast, travelling along the coastline towards Saldanha Bay and Langebaan. We stay over for the last 2 nights in Langebaan.

Day 10: August 31

The West Coast area offers a large and different variety of fauna and flora. Enjoy the day exploring the area, including a visit to Darling with its various wildflower reserves in and around town, the Tienie Versveld Wildflower Reserve. We end the day by visiting the West Coast National Park

Day 11: September 1

Depart after breakfast so that you are in time for your flight departure from Cape Town to Johannesburg. On arrival in Johannesburg, you will be met by a colleague and transferred home.

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Trip 11 – Overberg and whale watching

Duration: 7 days Departure: 5 September 2018 Last day: 11 September 2018

Overview

The Overberg region is beautiful during the springtime. We will be exploring this region with its rolling wheat and canola fields, visit the southernmost point of South Africa, explore some lesser known wine regions to do wine tasting, do whale watching, and visit many other exciting attractions.

Day 1: September 5

Guest will be picked up from their homes, and transferred to the airport. Time for the pickup, transfer and flight will be confirmed closer to the date.

Depart from the Cape Town Airport on a scenic 3 hour drive towards Swellendam. Arrive in the scenic town of Swellendam, where we will be staying for the first 3 nights of the trip. The town has a great village atmosphere, and it is easy to explore it and the wonderful gardens on foot. Dinners will be enjoyed at some of the many restaurants in the area.

Day 2: September 6

It is a day for nature, the ocean, whale watching and scenic mountains. A leisurely drive takes us towards the ocean. We travel to the famous De Hoop Nature Reserve, which is a big breeding area for the Southern Right whales. We view these gentle giants from the cliffs above and spend quality time here.

Day 3: September 7

Today is set out for very scenic drives. We will follow a circular route to explore some of the fruit and wine growing regions. Wine tasting will be done on route. We travel over the Tradouw Pass toward the charming town on Barrydale. We continue along Route 62 towards Montagu, where we will have lunch. Next is a drive through Cogmanskloof Pass towards Ashton and Robertson. The last part of this scenic drive is alongside the Breede River towards Bonnievale.

Day 4: September 8

It is time to move on, and to do another coastal visit in the Overberg region. We travel amongst the rolling hills filled with wheat and canola fields towards Bredasdorp, Struisbaai and the southernmost point of South Africa at Agulhas. We visit the lighthouse and maritime museum. On the return trip, we visit the famous Kapula Candle Factory and Julien's Pottery Galleries in Bredasdorp. We also visit the Shipwreck museum in town. From Bredasdorp we continue with another scenic drive towards Caledon and Rouxwil Country House. It is situated on a working wheat and sheep farm. We check in at the country house for the remaining four nights, and relax before dinner. Experience the Overberg hospitality. All dinners will be enjoyed at the farm

Day 5: September 9

A forty five minute drive takes us to the coastal town of Hermanus, where it is easy to view the southern right whales that are usually found in the bay below. Walk along the cliffs of Walker bay, and enjoy these unique giants of the sea. For those interested, we can arrange viewing of the whales from a boat. This needs to be arranged beforehand and at an additional cost. We return to the farm via the Hemel and Aarde Valley road.

Day 6: September 10

Today we will explore the wonderful Franschoek Valley. we travel alongside the Theewaterskloof dam, and over the Franschoek mountain pass (a lovely Fynbos region), with its stunning views of the valley below. In Franschoek, we will visit the wonderful Huguenot Museum

Day 7: September 11

After a last farm breakfast, it's time to return to Cape Town. On arrival in Johannesburg, guest will again be met by a colleague and transferred home.

We continue the drive today through remote parts of the Eastern Cape. Queenstown for lunch. The last part of the drive takes us through the towns of Fort Beaufort and Alice, and then it is uphill towards the charming village of the Hogsback. A lovely lunch will be enjoyed at a favourite coffee shop in town. After lunch, we drive alongside the Fish River towards the charming historical town of Cradock. On arrival in Cradock, we check into the "Tuishuise" for the next two nights' stay. It is a collection of wonderfully restored old houses depicting the Dutch and English Settlers period.

Day 6: October 19

The town of Cradock and its surroundings have many interesting attractions. Visit the Olive Schreiner Museum and then we also visit the Mountain Zebra National Park to explore the unique landscapes and animals of this park. The scenery in the park varies from grass covered plateaus to wooded ravines, and is a sanctuary for the rare Cape Mountain Zebra, and herds of Eland, Springbok, Kudu, Black wildebeest, Blesbok, Red Hartebeest, Cheetah, Meerkat and over 200 species of birds.

Day 7: October 20

On this last day we travel down towards Port Elizabeth. It is again a very scenic and mountainous route. We will arrive in Port Elizabeth around lunchtime and in time for the afternoon flight home around 14h00. On arrival in Johannesburg, guests will again be met by a colleague and transferred home.

The festival is during spring time, so the scenery all along the route will be very colourful. Please note that the final date for the festival in 2018 has not been finalised, but it is always held during the last weekend of October. If the dates for 2018 are different, guests that have booked will be informed.

Day 1: October 24

Guest will be picked up from their homes, and transferred to OR Tambo airport. Time for the pickup, transfer and flight will be confirmed closer to the date. On arrival your host will be waiting for you. We depart from the airport on a 2 hour drive to the Addo Elephant Park. We will check into the well-appointed chalets at Addo National Park for the first 2 nights of the tour. Around 16h00 we will do a first afternoon game drive in this wonderful park. Dinners and breakfasts at Addo will be prepared by your host.

Day 2: October 25

Today we will do game drives into the park to view the variety of animals, and especially the elephants. We will set aside some time as well for a bit of relaxation, where guest can view the water hole from their chalets. Enjoy the beauty of this park.

Day 3: October 26

After a last drive through the park it will be time to move on again. We travel from Addo towards the town of Somerset East. This is where we will check into the Angler and Antelope Guesthouse which will be our base for the 3 days. We are staying here as quality accommodation in Bedford itself is very limited. The Angler and Antelope is a 4 star graded guesthouse, with on suite facilities, and it also has a lovely restaurant.

After enjoying lunch in town, we also visit the town's museum, as well as the Walter Battiss museum. Somerset East is very central to the region. We will drive along the very scenic Blue Crane route towards the town of Pearston. After this lovely drive, we return to the guesthouse to relax before dinner.

Day 4 and 5: October 27 & 28

Over the next two days we will travel towards Bedford- 50 km away. The Bedford Garden festival has more than 40 gardens that are open to the public. Some of these gardens are on farms in the outlying areas of Bedford. So we will follow various routes to get too many of the prize winning gardens. We also visit the town Country Fair, where you can meander through craft stalls and sock up on local pantry fillers. Over the two days we will do the best of the festival.

Day 6: October 29

The journey home starts today, and we follow the N10 route via Middelburg, Noupoort, Colesberg and Springfontein. Being typical Karoo areas the landscape continuously changes from high mountain ranges and passes to open plains areas. Overnight in Bloemfontein

Day 7: October 30

Our last day will be all along the N1 route to Johannesburg, which is a good double carriageway. We travel via Venterburg and Kroonstad towards Johannesburg.

Cost of the 7-day tour is R13 700 per person sharing. Single supplement is R2 500

Trip 16 – Cherry Festival

Duration: 4 days

Departure: 16 November 2018

Last day: 19 November 2018

Overview

Together with the festival, also enjoy the spectacular red sandstone mountains of Golden Gate and the Maluti mountain regions, as well as visiting the popular town of Clarens.

Day 1: November 16 We travel via Villiers, Frankfort, Reitz and Bethlehem to visit and view these quaint little towns. Lunch will be enjoyed in one of these towns. After lunch we continue with the scenic drive. We visit the Ash River Fallout before arriving in the town of Clarens. Here we then check into the Patcham Place Guesthouse, where we be staying over for the duration of the trip. After checking in at the guesthouse, it is time to relax or to start exploring the town on foot. Dinners will be at different restaurants in town.

Day 2: November 17

Today is the best day to attend the Cherry festival, as it becomes very busy over the weekend itself. We take the very scenic Highlands route towards Ficksburg. The town nestles between the foot of the Imperani Mountain and the banks of the Caledon River, the border with Lesotho. The district is renowned for the breathtaking sandstone formations of the mountains here. Many of the older buildings in and around the town were built of sandstone. The Cherry Festival is the oldest crop festival in South Africa. It is estimated that there are 500 hectares of cherry trees in the Eastern Free State concentrated mainly in the Ficksburg, Clocolan and Fouriesburg area. There are approximately 250 trees per hectare and the average yield per hectare is 10 tons.

On arrival in Ficksburg, we first drive through the town to visit the main features and buildings in town, and enjoy a lovely cup of coffee. Thereafter guests have the opportunity to explore the festival area and town, and attend events as per the festival program. Enough time is allowed to explore the whole festival area. At around 15h00, it is time to do a tour of a Cherry farm. We visit the cherry orchards at Ionia farm. This tour includes a tractor trip to the orchards on the farm for some picking, a tour of the packing shed, information on the cultivation and packing of cherries, plus a punnet to fill and take home. Jams, liqueur, wine, fresh cherries etc, will be on sale. The farm is on route back to Clarens, so the drive back home will be shorter than this morning.

Day 3: November 18

It is time to focus on the natural beauty of the area. During the morning, we travel to Golden Gate National Park. We travel through the park to view the wildlife and birdlife, and interesting rock formations of the park. It is a real photographic delight. After spending quality time in the park we return towards Clarens. The town has a big variety of art galleries and craft shops, all within very close distance from the main square, and the guesthouse. Guest will have the afternoon to spend at leisure roaming the town and enjoy the real village life. The streets are very safe to walk around in.

Day 4: November 19

Guests will have a last opportunity to visit the many craft shops and galleries in Clarens. We then start with the journey back towards the city. We will arrive back in the city in the early to mid-afternoon.
