Covid-19

We will have to refuse you entry to the tour should you have any signs of <u>Covid or Swine Flu at the start of the tour</u>. All guests must disclose honestly if they have symptoms or were in contact with positive case in the 14 days prior to the tour departure. Any fever or symptoms whilst on tour must be reported immediately to the Guide.

Pricing and departure dates: All tours for 2026 have been agreed upon and fixed at the published rates. Once you have booked and paid the relevant deposits, these prices will be maintained.

Flights – If your trip includes a flight HOLA will still book your flight and let you know the costs before we confirm. <u>Flights are no longer included in the costs</u>.

The tour price includes: All land transportation costs and accommodation in carefully selected guesthouses, hotels. Two full meals per day- breakfast and dinner- unless specified for trips with full board rate. All entrance and related fees in national parks, museums and attractions, guided tours. Activities as per Itinerary is included. Trips includes airport transfers as well

The tour price includes and excludes as per each individual ltinerary. We do try to include as much as possible but in general NOT included are: lunch, any beverages with meals, telephone calls, laundry, items of a personal nature, flight, activities not specified, gratuities to lodge/hotel staff, and if relevant, gratuities to nature / specialist guides.

Single Supplement: It is purely for the extra cost of a single room, and no extra costs are added. Single travellers are gladly accommodated.

Accommodations at selected Guesthouse/Lodge/Hotel is subject to change and HOLA reserves the right to change to suitable accommodations of same standard and quality.

Travel Insurance cover: Normal insurance and medical cover for traveling passengers is recommended. Please ensure you have the correct insurance cover to cover protection against trip cancellation or interruption for unexpected medical reasons, medical cover for illness or injury whilst on tour, emergency medical evacuation benefits, protection against baggage loss, theft or damage, and 24-hour assistance anywhere on route.

Malaria: On certain trips we do travel to areas that are within a malaria risk areas. Appropriate prevention is advised, and you should consult with a doctor for advice.

Special conditions regarding mobility of guests:

All effort is made to ensure the places we visit and stay is easily access-able to all. On all tours there are inevitably areas that involve climbing of steps, walking to attractions, walking on uneven ground and surfaces, etc. All persons on tour must be able to do these activities un-assisted and without delaying their fellow passengers.

Should travellers not be able walk freely, climb steps or do any activities unassisted, they would be required to have their own assistance (a person travelling with them) to ensure fellow travellers are not affected by this. The

Hola Tourism Network needs to be informed of any such conditions before the reservation is made.

Although no age limit applies to participation in the tours, it is important to declare any medical conditions on the reservation form which will be sent when the reservation is made. The Hola Tourism Network reserves the right to cancel the reservation if a person's medical condition is too much of a risk to undertake any of the trips.

For everyone's comfort and fairness, seats in the vehicle are rotated on a daily basis. No specific seat can be reserved in the vehicle due to a medical condition or handicap. Everyone needs to rotate seats.

The chosen accommodation always has on-suite bathroom facilities, but the choice of a bath or shower cannot always be specified or guaranteed. Should this be a problem, please enquire before a reservation is made.

Guests must be aware of the traveling distances covered per day, and that it may be longer on certain days due to continuous road works.

We reserve the right to send a person home due to bad conduct or disrupting a tour at own cost and no refund.

Useful information to plan your trip:

Weather: Depending on the time of the year we travel, the weather will differ. Your host will gladly advise you with what relevant clothing to take on the trip. A suggestion is to always have some layered clothing, at least a warm jacket and raincoat and umbrella. The Hola Tourism Network cannot be held accountable for the weather experienced on trips.

Dress Code: The dress code on all trips is casual.

Luggage: Is limited to one suitcase per person which goes into the trailer, plus a small carry-on bag for inside the vehicle.

What else to take: Binoculars, cameras, hat and sunscreen, comfortable walking shoes, and a keen sense of adventure. Insect repellent and malaria prophylactics are advised on certain trips.

Laundry: facilities and service is available at all places of stay at own cost.

- Enjoy breakfast before you can go and relax in your room, around the pool or our lounge until lunch time.
- After lunch you have some more time to relax before high tea and your evening open vehicle game drive. You will stop again for sundowners in the bush, enjoying a drink and snacks and watching the sun set over the African bush.
- Returning to the Lodge for dinner.

Day 3: Tambuti Lodge, Pilanesberg (08 February)

Day 1: Guesthouse, Cape Town (14 February)

- Guest will be picked up from their homes, and transferred to OR Tambo airport.
- Your Guide will be waiting for you on arrival at the Cape Town International Airport. Depart from the airport on a scenic drive
- Our first activity on the trip will be to visit Table Mountain (weather permitting and own account). We will use the aerial cableway to go to the top of the mountain, (and down) with its spectacular views of the Cape. A light lunch will also be enjoyed at the top. Guest will have time to walk along the pathways offering great views of different parts of Cape Town.
- Drive to Signal Hill to get a different view of the Cape. Form here it's a short drive to check in at our Guesthouse. We will be here for 3 nights. Dinners will be at various restaurants in Cape Town

Day 2: Guesthouse, Cape Town (15 February)

• After breakfast travel along the Atlantic Seaboard to Clifton and Camps Bay to view the 12 Apostles, towards Hout Bay.

- Then we set off via the spectacular Chapman's Peak road towards Cape Point.
- The scenic drive continues towards Simon's Town, where we will also visit the African Penguin colony at Boulders Beach.
- The drive then continues via the harbour suburbs / towns of Fish Hoek, Kalk Bay and Muizenberg.
- Return to our Guesthouse late afternoon

Day 3: Guesthouse, Cape Town	(16 February)
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- During the morning, we will visit the city attractions, driving through many of the attractive suburbs, and visit the National Museum, the Parliament precinct, Greenmarket Square, and the Bo-Kaap area.
- Visit the Blue and Red arts and craft sheds, the Clock Tower precinct, and many interesting shops all over the Waterfront.
- Enjoy dinner at the V & A Waterfront

Day 4: Montagu Country Hotel, (17 February)

- We are off towards the more rural areas of the Cape today. The scenic drive will take us via the towns of Paarl & Rawsonville, where we will visit some of the museums and its popular tourist spots. On route, we will start driving through the fruit growing areas, where we will see the harvesting of grapes, peaches, pears, apples, berries,
- We drive along this lovely green valley towards Robertson where we will visit Excelsion Wine Estate where you can blend, bottle and cork and label your own Excelsior red wine.
- Arrive in Montagu late afternoon, where we will stay over for the next 2 night's in Montagu hotel.

Day 5: Montagu Country Hotel, (18 February)

- Today we will do a lovely drive towards the Keisie Valley, through the Burger's pass.
- We then go on a very scenic tractor ride up the Langkloof Mountain with the Protea Farm to view the various Protea species growing high up in the mountain.

• Returning via the Burgers Pass, we will then visit the Montagu dried fruit factory, and some of the museums in town. There will be enough time left in the day to wander around town.

Day 6: Aan de Oever, Swellendam (19 February)

- A real highlight of the tour is a scenic drive towards Cape Agulhas. Today we travel via Stormsvlei to Bredasdorp and Struisbaai to the southernmost point of Africa, at L'Agulhas. We drive around these towns, taking in the long stretches of beach, visit the Lighthouse
- Lunch in Struisbaai in the harbour, maybe we are lucky and the Stingray's will visit whilst we are there.
- We continue the last part of the day travelling to Swellendam where we will overnight

Day 7: Mossel Bay (20 February)

- After breakfast depart for Mosselbay. On the way we will stop in Albertina at the Aloe Factory to see the different products and how they make creams, etc from Aloes.
- Visit the Bartolomeu Dias Museum Complex and then lunch at the seaside. After lunch we visit the archaeological cave site at the Point of Human Origins in Mosselbay. *** this requires climbing stairs and will be optional to visit.
- Check into our Guesthouse and enjoy a walk on the beach or just sit on the lovely deck looking out over the ocean.

Day 8: End of Itinerary (21 February)

Breakfast and our last morning. We will check out and go to George Airport for your flight home. You will again be met at the airport and transferred home.

Trip 3 – Sutherland & Karoo 8 Days / 7 Nights 22 February 2026 - 01 March 2026



Klein Karoo visit with amazing star gazing in Sutherland, travelling via some fantastic mountain passes. Visiting small towns and enjoying the Karoo

Day 1: Prince Albert (22 February)

Guest will be picked up from their homes, and transferred to OR Tambo airport. Time for the pickup, transfer and flight will be confirmed closer to the date. Depart from the George airport on a scenic drive towards Prince Albert. We travel over the scenic Outeniqua Mountains, through Oudtshoorn and De Rust before arriving in the beautiful Prince Albert valley. Here we then check into our Guesthouse for the first 2 nights of stay. Relax and enjoy the beautiful gardens.

Day 2: Prince Albert (23 February)

The day is set aside to travel along the most scenic and finest mountain passes in the Karoo, which is the Swartberg pass. This 27 km untarred road winds up to a summit at 1583 metres above sea level, with breathtaking views on every turn. The pass descends into the valley close to the famous Cango

caves. After visiting the caves, we will again return to Prince Albert over the same pass, but this time in the opposite direction. In the afternoon, guest will have time to visit the museum, and explore the town on foot. *** swartberg pass weather dependent.

Day 3: Sutherland (24 February)

Today we are travelling to one of the most well - known towns of the Karoo, namely Sutherland. We travel through parts of the Greater Karoo towards Matjiesfontein. We stop at this historical town to visit the wonderful museum and Victorian village. After enjoying lunch at the village, we continue in a northerly direction towards Sutherland. See how the landscapes continuously changes, and travel through the spectacular Verlatenkloof Mountain Pass. Guest will be surprised by the variety of changing landscapes and farms found along this route. On arrival in Sutherland, we check into our Guesthouse for next two nights. The guesthouse is centrally located near the town centre, and we start exploring the town on foot.

Day 4: Sutherland (25 February)

Sutherland is known for a few things, one being one of the coldest places in the country, but more significantly it is due to it being one of the darkest places. One of the world's most important astronomical observatories is situated here, including the South African Large Telescope (SALT). During the morning, we will participate in an informative tour of this modern facility. In the evening, we participate in a stargazing experience, hosted by Jurg Wagenaar. This is a very informative session, including an initial presentation and DVD to understand the basics of astronomy, followed by stargazing through telescopes

Day 5: Beaufort west (26 February)

Today we leave this lovely town, and travel back towards main road and Laingsburg, where we visit the Flood Museum. We then travel in an easterly direction to the charming town of Beaufort West. We explore this hidden gem of the Karoo. After enjoying some time in town, we travel to the outskirts of the town, and check into our accommodation for two nights. From the veranda guests will have a lovely view of the big spaces of the Karoo, as well as the high mountains surrounding the farm. Relax and enjoy the beautiful gardens, and the traditional farm dinners in the evenings.

Day 6: Western Cape (27 February)

The region has a beautiful national park, and today we will be visiting the Karoo National Park. After lunch at the park, we make our way back to the farm, for some time to relax, before we do a sunset game drive on the farm

Day 7: Guest House, Bloemfontein

(28 February)

Sadly, we start leaving the Karoo behind us on the route back home. We continue through the Great Karoo, and travel via Richmond and Hanover towards Colesberg, where we will enjoy lunch. We continue on the last leg of the day towards Bloemfontein. We check into our Guesthouse, situated in the quiet suburbs of town, for our last stay on tour.

Day 8: End of Itinerary (1 March)

We travel via Bloemfontein and Kroonstad towards Johannesburg. Guests will be dropped off at their home in the afternoon.

Relax, explore the Lodge and walk on the 250 meters of boardwalk along the Chobe. Depart for a later afternoon open game drive or boat cruise and return to the Lodge for dinner.

Day 1: Needles Lodge, Kruger National Park (11 April) We depart early morning from Johannesburg to avoid any peak hour traffic. We travel toward Nelspruit with lunch on route. Arrive at Needles Lodge late afternoon, check in for the next 4 nights. All dinners will be at the Lodge – either in the Boma or on the deck. Enjoy all the animals around the Lodge and wait for the Bushbabies to wake up for the night

Day 2 and 3: Needles Lodge, Kruger (12/13 April)

Enjoy the view from your room with coffee/tea before we enjoy a lovely breakfast and then head off into the Kruger Park for the day. Stopping at picnic spots and camps for lunch and refreshments. Returning to our Lodge in the afternoon for a bit of rest and enjoying the beauty of the lodge gardens.

Day 4: Needles Lodge, Kruger National Park (14 April)

Early morning wake-up call with coffee/tea and rusks before departing on the game viewing for the day. Drive up to Skukuza camp for breakfast or lunch at the old Train Station before we turn around and return to Needles.

Day 5: End of Itinerary (15 April)

8 Days / 7 Nights 18 April 2025 – 25 April 2026



Nestled in the heart of Southern Africa, Swaziland, officially known as the Kingdom of Eswatini, and Natal, also known as KwaZulu-Natal, offer visitors a captivating blend of culture, history, and natural beauty. Swaziland, bordered by Mozambique and South Africa, boasts stunning landscapes ranging from lush lowlands to the rugged Drakensberg mountains

Day 1: Foresters Arms, eSwatini (18 April)

We depart from your home towards the Swaziland border post of Oshoek. We will travel along the main N4 route via Middleburg, Belfast, and Carolina before we get to the border post. After border formalities, it is short drive before we reach the famous Ngwenya Glass factory. Here we do a tour of the factory to see how the glass is blown. Then it is another 20 minute drive towards Mbabane, from where we drive another 40 minutes into the scenic mountain areas, and check into the Foresters Arms Country Hotel for a 2 night stay. Relax and enjoy the lovely gardens and views, before enjoying the first of the special dinners at the hotel.

Day 2: Foresters Arms, eSwatini

(19 April)

Today is set out to visit all the wonderful sights of the Mbabane and Ezulweni Valley Region. We will do a slow easy drive down the scenic valley to visit some arts and craft centre, the Swazi Candle Shop. We will also have lunch on route, before then travelling to the Mbabane CBD for a drive through tour of the capital city. We then return to the hotel in the afternoon for some rest and relaxing before dinner.

Day 3: Hlane I National Park Ndlovu Camp, (20 April) After a relaxing breakfast overlooking the forest, it is time to depart from this lovely country hotel. We will follow a very scenic route to Hlane Royal National Park via Manzini.

Sunset game drive (2.5 hrs) We still stay over at Ndlovu camp for the next 2 night. After the sunset game drive dinner will be enjoyed at the restaurant

Day 4: Hlane National Park Ndlovu Camp,(21 April)After breakfast we enjoy a Midday game drive.

After the midday game drive we will relax and watch the waterhole that is frequented by elephant, rhino, giraffe and other species providing photographic opportunities throughout the day. Dinner at the restaurant

Day 5: Ghost Mountain Inn, Mkhuze (22 April)

After a relaxing breakfast overlooking the forest, it is time to depart from this lovely camp. We will follow a very scenic route today through the eastern and southern parts of Eswatini, towards the Lavumisa Border post. On route, you will see a variety of agricultural farms and traditional Swazi homesteads. The trip to the border post is about 2 hours.

Once again, border crossing formalities have to be done before we are back in South Africa. We then travel through the Pongola district of KwaZulu Natal, towards Mkuze. It is here that we check into the well-known Ghost Mountain Inn for another 3 night stay.

On arrival we will enjoy a lovely lunch on the terrace, and thereafter you will have time to relax and enjoy the pool and lovely gardens.

Day 6: Ghost Mountain Inn, Mkhuze (23 April)

Day 7: Ghost Mountain Inn, Mkhuze (24 April)

Today we will visit the Hluhluwe Game Reserve. It is a 50 km drive to the entrance of the park. On arrival at the Game reserve, we will do a trip into the park on an open vehicle. This reserve is a classical big 5 reserve, but is mostly known for its conservation efforts to save the black and white rhinos. around every corner you will see more dune landscapes. We arrive at the Kgalagadi Lodge (5km from the gate) and check into the well- appointed chalets for 1 night. We relax for the remainder of the afternoon before dinner is enjoyed at the Restaurant.

Day 3: Kgalagadi Lodge,) (5 May)

After a healthy breakfast, we depart into the park. Driving in the dry river beds we start our search for the animals of the Kgalagadi, visiting various water holes and picnic spots during the day before we return to the lodge in the afternoon. Enjoy dinner prepared by your host

Day 4: !Xaus Lodge, Kgalagadi (6 May)

This lodge offers a remote and tranquil wilderness experience for guests looking for total isolation. Meet the Bushmen community and interact with them on game walks and game drives.

Relax in the luxury chalets, experience the remoteness of the area and enjoy wonderful meals provided by your hosts. Game drives and bush walks will be done. We spend 2 nights at !Xaus Lodge

Overnight: !Xaus Lodge

!Xaus Lodge provides accommodation in the Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park for eco-tourists and visitors to the Kalahari. The complex comprises a central lodge building and 12 individual, on-suite chalets, each with its own deck overlooking a vast saltpan and waterhole fed with fresh water. The central lodge building comprises a welcoming reception area, a cosy lounge with a fireplace and a lovely library. Visit the large observation deck from which we gaze in wonder at the night sky, and by day the swimming pool provides cool relief from the desert heat.

Day 5: !Xaus Lodge, Kgalagadi) (7 May)

We have an early wake up call for a walk into the Dunes to learn some of the Bushmen Culture. Returning to the Lodge for breakfast and time to relax before lunch. Late afternoon game drive with sundowners on a dune watching the African sun setting.... followed by dinner at the Lodge.

Day 6: Guesthouse, Northern Cape (8 May)

We depart early with a packed breakfast that we will have at Kamqua picnic spot. Our road back is over the 92 sand dunes for our return to the Auob river and transfer over to our microbus. We travel from Kamqua picnic spot to Twee Rivieren gate enjoying our last game drive until we leave the park. Tonight, we sleep in Kathu

Day 1: Tshugulu Lodge, Mapungubwe (23 May)

We depart early morning as we have a long drive ahead of us. It fortunately is all on the N1, which is a double highway. We travel on the N1 route towards Polokwane and Makhado (Louis Trichard). Over the lovely Soutpansberg mountain range, through the tunnels, and onwards towards Musina. The whole route from Makhado to Mapungubwe is covered by giant Baobab trees. At Musina we turn in a westerly direction towards the Mapungubwe National Park. We stay in the park at a lovely self-catering guest house. We will for the duration of the tour have breakfast & dinner at the guest house.

Day 2: Tshugulu Lodge, Mapungubwe (24 May)

It is best to do the tour of Mapungubwe Hill early in the morning, otherwise it becomes too hot. So, we will depart early on the short drive to Mapungubwe National Park. On arrival at the park our first guided trip will be to Mapungubwe Hill. On doing the guided trip to the "Hill" guest must also realise that there is a set of steps (easy going, but many – 147steps) to climb to get to the top of the hill. We do the climbing very slowly. After doing the 3 hour guided tour to the Hill, we travel back to the guest house for a lovely brunch, and time to relax.

Around 14h00 we will have a light meal before returning to the park to visit the wonderful Mapungubwe Museum and Information centre, where many of the artefacts and information of Mapungubwe Hill is on display. For persons who perhaps do not want to do the climb of the hill in the morning, the information centre will be a good

Day 3: Tshugulu Lodge, Mapungubwe (25 May)

After a relaxing breakfast, it is time to visit the nature side of the Mapungubwe National Park on an open vehicle. We will travel via various paths in the park.

Please note the drive focuses mainly on the natural beauty of the park – its fantastic landscapes, rock formations and Baobab trees, and not the animals only. The Northern boundary of the park is the Limpopo River, and on its bank, it has giant fever trees, Mashatu or Nyala berry trees and Sycamore fig trees. The look - out point overlooking the confluence of the Shashe and Limpopo rivers is an awe-inspiring vista where three countries - Zimbabwe, Botswana and South Africa - meet. This is where will enjoy a picnic lunch. Wildlife at present includes elephant, white rhino, leopard, hyena, giraffe, eland, gemsbok, blue wildebeest, red hartebeest, zebra, kudu, waterbuck, impala, bushbuck, klipspringer and other plains game. This experience lasts for about 4 hours, where after guests will enjoy tea and cookies on our return at the guest house, followed by time to relax and dinner.

Day 4: Tshugulu Lodge, Mapungubwe (26 May)
